Section One. It shall be the duty of the owners of the abutting lots or lands in the Borough of Jermyn, Penna., to keep sidewalks in good repair and in a safe condition for travel, either as against ordinary wear and tear, ditches, tracks or obstructions. Any failure to do so shall be deemed negligence on the part of the lot owner, and such owner shall be liable for damages which may occur by reason of such negligence.

> Section Three. Any owner of such lots as shall fail to comply with the provisions of Sections One and Two of this Ordinance shall also forfeit and pay a fine of Ten Dollars for each offence, and each continued failure or neglect to comply with the provisions of this Ordinance for a period of ten days shall constitute a new offense.

Section Five. Any person or persons, firm or corporation neglecting or refusing to clean his, their or its sidewalks or gutters as aforesaid and as provided in Section Four shall be liable to a fine of not less thon Five Dollars nor more than Ten Dollars (the amount of the fine to be determined by the length of the sidewalk in question) for each offense, and every period of twelve hours that said sidewalks and gutters shall be left in such condition shall constitute a new offense and shall make the owner or owners and persons residing thereon again liable to said penalty; provided that the provisions of this Section shall not apply to places where no sidewalks are laid, provided the same have not been directed to be laid.

Section Six. Recovery of the penalties provided for in this Ordinance shall be by complaint to the Burgess or any Justice of the Peace of the Borough of Jermyn, upon affidavit of the person making the complaint, Whereupon the Burgess or Justice of the Peace before whom the

said complaint and upon conviction of Ordinance may fine the defendent offender as hereinbefore provided; and in default of payment of said penalty and costs may commit the said defendent offender to the Lackawanna County Jail until the said penalty and costs are paid; such imprisonment, however, in no case to exceed ten days for any one con-

Section Seven. · All fines and penalties which may be recovered by the Burgess or Justice of the Peace by virtue of convictions under any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be paid to the Borough Treasurer within Thirty (30) days from date of collection.
